

# Interstate 70 Cave Springs to Fairgrounds Design-Build Project Update



The Design-Build project is a partnership with St. Charles County, who has contributed

of the \$62 Million cost of project improvements.

The Missouri Department of Transportation, in partnership with St. Charles County, will hold an open house for the Interstate 70 Cave Springs to Fairgrounds Design-Build Project on **Tuesday, June 28 from 4:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.** The open house will take place in room #105 at the St. Charles Convention Center, 1 Convention Center Plaza, St. Charles, MO 63303. Room 105 is in the lower level of the convention center.

No formal presentations will be made during the meeting. Attendees can stop by at any time during the meeting to view the design of the Zumbahl and Cave Springs interchanges, a new section of North Outer Road and project construction schedule and speak with the I-70 team. There will also be an opportunity to fill out a comment form to provide feedback.

This meeting is accessible to individuals with disabilities. Masks are optional.

## >>> WHAT'S NEXT

Drivers traveling in both directions of Interstate 70 at the Cave Springs and Zumbahl interchanges may be delayed starting Monday, June 27, weather permitting. Crews will begin reducing the interstate lanes and adding barrier wall between the median and shoulders underneath each interchange. One lane in each direction will be closed Monday through Friday from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. as crews will install barrier walls and temporary striping. Lanes will be reduced from the standard 12-foot lanes to temporary 11-foot lanes. The reduction in lane widths will remain in place on I-70 through mid-2023. This work is part of reconstructing the Cave Springs and Zumbahl interchanges as single point urban interchanges (SPUI) for the I-70 Cave Springs to Fairgrounds Design-Build Project. When work on the interchange bridges begin, both interchanges will remain open to drivers.
